
Year 10: Philosophy, Religion and Ethics

Curriculum Intent:

Students will grasp Christian understandings of the concept of God, by exploring different Christian teachings and beliefs about what God is like, God's relationship with the world and with humanity. They will understand the reasons for different views on God as good, the meaning of goodness in the context of God's actions and views on the relationship between God and human suffering. Students will be aware of the justifications Christians give for different views, attitudes and understandings, from the perspectives of different Christian denominations. They will also explore Christian philosophical views on the nature of reality and the reasons for belief in God and the different ways in which Christians believe God might be revealed as well as exploring different forms of religious experience.
