Year: 7 Subject: Drama

Curriculum Intent:

Students will learn the basics of communicating meaning through physical and vocal skills. Students will know how to develop basic characterisation skills for performance of an ancient Greek text. They will know how to describe that characterisation using subject specific vocabulary; identifying how it communicates meaning to an audience and judging its overall effectiveness. They will learn the basics of design – staging, lighting, costume, and sound. Students will understand how to respond to a stimulus using devising conventions and they will develop basic knowledge of the roles of a range of theatre makers.
