


## **Curriculum Intent:**

The Year 7 curriculum will introduce students to the fundamental key language and grammar they will need to progress successfully throughout their language learning journey in school. It aims to inspire a love for language learning through engaging teaching and learning, focusing on all four skill areas: listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students will begin to have a cultural awareness of German and German-speaking countries through cultural activities linked to the language topic area they are covering. Key knowledge is reviewed regularly through vocabulary tests in class and assessments in different skill areas at the end of each module.

By the end of the year, Year 7 students will have:

- A sound knowledge and understanding of the present tense,
   with a developing knowledge of the near future tense.
- A sound understanding of the use of articles and simple adjective rules.
- A good knowledge of the key vocabulary from the topics studied

- The ability to speak and write in complex sentences using a variety of opinions, connectives and reasons.
- The ability to gain understanding from a range of spoken and written resources.
