## **DESIGN TECHNOLOGY - Assessment & Feedback Policy**

## General guidelines for all assessment and feedback

- > Assessment will be primarily formative.
- > Assessment will form part of every lesson.
- > Teachers should maximise opportunities for questioning all students in the lesson.
- > Teachers should frequently use low stakes assessment to systematically test students' cumulative acquisition of knowledge.

Teachers will follow the Faculty Assessment and Marking guidelines based on the following principals.

- > Students will receive regular feedback from their teachers.
- > Feedback may be either written or verbal.
- > Students will have the opportunity to act upon the feedback they have been given.
- > Students will be given advance notice of any pieces of work that will be formally assessed.

## Year 7 & 8

- Students will receive regular verbal feedback on their practical work and have the opportunity to act upon the feedback.
- Written feedback will be given at least once per project.
- > If a piece of work is to be formally assessed students will be given advance notice of this.
- > Assessments both written and practical will provide teachers with sufficient information to award a CLG.
- ➤ Books and folders will receive a 'maintenance scrutiny' once per ½ term

## GCSE and A level

- > Years 9,10 and 11 students will receive written feedback at appropriate stages of the course.
- > Practical work will receive regular and timely feedback to allow students to act upon this and improve their work
- > Once students are working on their NEA, feedback will be given as per the guidelines issued by the exam board and JCQ.
- > If a piece of work is to be formally assessed students will be given advance notice of this.
- > Assessments both written and practical will provide teachers with sufficient information to award a CLG.
- > End of year exam/PPE/ assessments will be formally marked and receive feedback- this may be in class feedback or written.
- ➤ Books and folders will receive a 'maintenance scrutiny' once per ½ term
