MATHEMATICS - Assessment and Feedback

General guidelines for all assessment and feedback



- > Students will receive timely and regular feedback from their teachers.
- > Feedback will be given in a wide range of ways: eg. verbal, written, recorded, from peers.
- ➤ All students will be given opportunities to act upon their feedback.
- Questioning will occur every lesson and be targeted where possible.
- Formal assessments will occur throughout the year as organised by the year group leader.

KS3

- ➤ In Years 7,8 and 9, students will receive regular feedback.
- Feedback may take a variety of forms written, verbal, recorded. Students will be told where the feedback is so they can access it.
- > Students will complete starter activities as part of their ongoing low stakes assessment. Feedback will be given back immediately.
- Verbal feedback will be explicit and a planned part of time in a lesson.
- > Topic tests in Year 8 and 9 will be carried out where appropriate to the SOW
- > Standardised Topic tests in Year 7 will be carried out where appropriate to the SOW in order to determine the student's mastery of mathematics
- > Homework may be written or online. Feedback must be timely.
- Acknowledgement marking of class notes or homework is not required.
- > Books will be scrutinised for pride.

GCSE

- In Years 10, and 11, students will receive regular feedback.
- Feedback may take a variety of forms written, verbal, recorded. Students will be told where the feedback is so they can access it.
- > Students will complete the 5-a-day starters as part of their ongoing low stakes assessment. Feedback will be given back immediately.
- > Topic tests will be carried out where appropriate to the SOW
- > Verbal feedback will be explicit and a planned part of time in a lesson.
- > Homework may be written or online. Feedback must be timely.
- Acknowledgement marking of class notes or homework is not required.
- Books will be scrutinised for pride.

Sixth Form

- ➤ In the sixth form, students will receive regular feedback from their teachers.
- Feedback may take a variety of forms written, verbal, recorded. Students will be told where the feedback is so they can access it.
- Verbal feedback will be explicit and a planned part of time in a lesson.
- > Assessed homework will occur at the end of a topic, with whole class feedback given for common issues.
