Author Profile: Matt Haig

Matt Haig is an English author and journalist who writes for both adults, children, and young adults.

He was born in Sheffield in 1975 and studied English and History at the University of Hull. He started writing after university, and has written many different types of books. Reasons to Stay Alive is a non-fiction book about Matt's struggle with depression; The Last Family in England is an adaptation of the Shakespeare play Henry IV, Part 1, as is his book Dead Fathers Club, which is an adaptation of Hamlet. He has also written novels featuring vampires called The Radley, and another featuring aliens called The Humans. His most popular book is The Midnight Library.

Most of his work focuses on the human condition and what it means to be alive.

Matt Haig is open about his struggle with anxiety, ADHD and autism. He lives in Brighton with his wife and children.

The 22nd of July is **International Brain Day**. Why not borrow a book about neurology from the ILC this month?


The 27th of July is National Day of the Cowboy in the USA. Yee-haw!

What to watch: Charlotte's Web (2006)


Based on E B White's novel, Charlotte's Web is the story of a young girl, a young pig, and a very wise and talented spider who wants to help!
