93 talented Sixth Form Mathematicians took on UK Mathematics Trust's (UKMT) National Senior Maths Challenge earlier in the term. The results were fantastic and we achieved 12 Gold, 19 Silver, 36 Bronze and 26 Participation medals. The 12 Gold medallists have now qualified for the prestigious 'Kangaroo Round' of the Challenge where they can demonstrate their mathematical skills further! This is a fantastic achievement and I look forward to seeing how students perform in the national round!
