St Marks Meals

As many of you will know, we are a proud provider of the St Marks Meals. Last Christmas, they packed and delivered close to 500 meal boxes, an increase of 28% compared to the previous year. The need amongst the most vulnerable is set to rise, therefore, they are aiming to raise £3500 to help cover the cost of the food and boxes. Last year, they experienced one of their most demanding periods, during which they packed and delivered nearly 7,000 meal boxes. Each meal box provides four plates of food, so 28,000 people went to bed with full stomachs. St Marks Meals desperately need help to ensure they do the same again this year.
